When we tell a story in a theater, we repeat it and repeat it, night after night. Those moments of the actor's lives are gone forever as they repeat the lives of a fictional character instead of living their own life. It is a consensual exchange, this transaction that the actor makes.

In the text of this play, we are placed into a world where there is another consensual layer; each character decides to relinquish a piece of themselves so that something else may take place. It can be seen as an act of generosity and attention as the story unfolds. There are layers of consent upon consent in the script. The actors and I found ourselves confronted with the extraordinary demands of multiple vulnerabilities and the toll this takes on both the individual and the collective.

We had to learn to be very kind to each other as a consequence, or perhaps as a prize.

When you give over to the art and the effort of attention, the act of it becomes so full, that the "I" disappears.

Right Now, or in other words, the present moment, is not finite, or affixed, because time is only the substitute for eternity, or the absence of time. And so the fabric of the world in this play has been dicey for us chronologists, we have schedules and deadlines, we have boundaries and thresholds. We are still learning how to be in the world Catherine-Anne Toupin wrote. We are thrilled you are here to see it.



Graduating from The Conservatory of Dramatic Arts in Montreal in 1999, she has become a well-known actress in Quebec, with numerous theatre, film and television credits. As a playwright, Toupin has written three full-length plays: À présent, L'envie and Alexandre, as well as many short plays. In 2005, Right Now (À présent) won the Prix Françoise-Berd, awarded to the best new play by a young author. The play has been translated into four languages and has previously been produced in Canada, Italy and Mexico.

Marz Allswede (Stage Manager) (he/him) has been working in theater since 2014.
